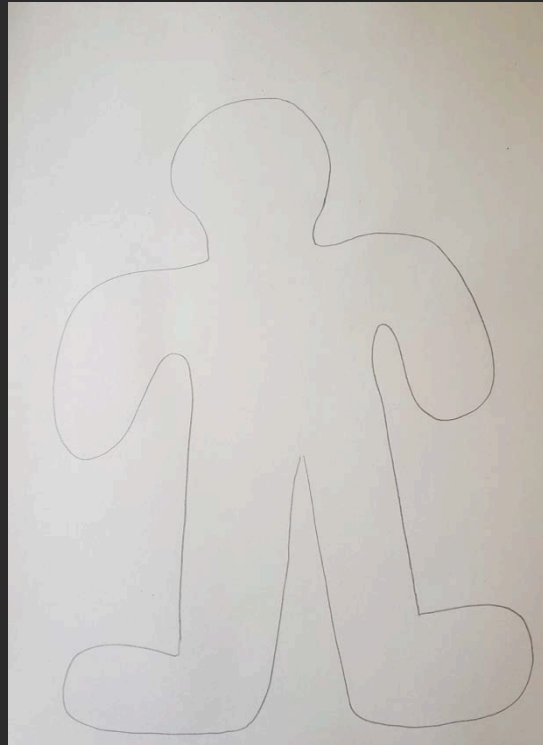
What is Collage?

Collage is art made by cutting up or tearing materials such as colored paper, string, fabric, and newspaper and then gluing them together to make a picture.



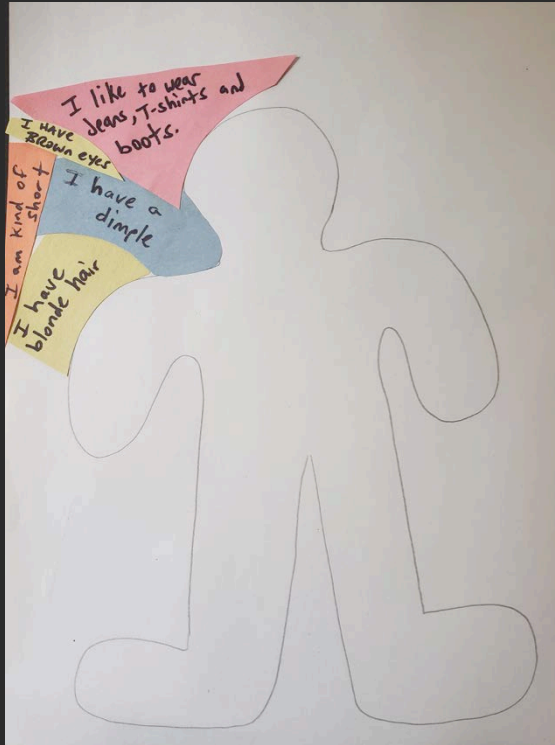
Draw A Figure

Do the best you can to draw the outline of a human on your piece of paper. Draw this somewhat large.



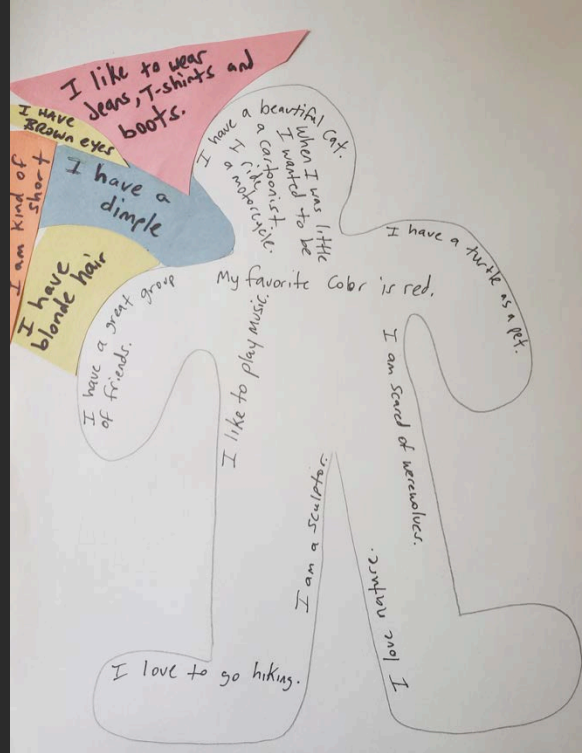
Physical Attributes

Begin collaging the outside of your figure drawing. On each piece of torn or cut paper you collage add a physical attribute. Try and fill the entire space outside of the figure.



Personal Characteristics

On the inside of your figure, write your thoughts, feelings, dreams and accomplishments. What makes you unique? Try your best to fill the entire space.
